'Remote Teaching and Learning' refers to the provision of online learning activities, teacher support, assessment and feedback from teachers to pupils in the event that normal lessons are unable to be delivered 'face-to-face' as normal.

Dear Parent/Carer

As you all know, during these unprecedented times technology has been a fantastic resource in allowing us to continue to deliver high quality teaching and learning remotely. We therefore, as a school, are endeavouring to ensure this high quality education will continue no matter the circumstances or a child, family, 'bubble' or staff member.

In order to do this a number of online platforms will be used to facilitate your children's ongoing learning, which will continue to be based on the national curriculum and our curriculum design. The platform used may vary depending on the year group of your child as outlined in the 'Remote Teaching and Learning Policy'.

The circumstances of each individual or family may vary depending on their personal circumstances. Therefore, we have put in place a number of provisions to ensure every child will have access to the appropriate resources within a timeline reflective of those circumstances.

Remote teaching and learning does however rely on access to the internet and a device capable of facilitating the online platforms being used. If you do not have access to the internet or any devices, school will provide paper copies of learning. It is important that you share this information with school, so appropriate preparations can be made.
