Gradings

There is no Government expectation to report levels or grades to parents this year, due to no national testing in any year group and of course a period of lockdown this year.

However, we at Lakeside think it is important to share information with you that helps celebrate achievements and be able to work together to identify gaps in learning and do something about them.

Your child's end of year report will have a 'best fit' teacher assessed attainment grade - that is the attainment grade based upon the work and the tests the children have completed. There are inevitably going to be some curriculum knowledge gaps unassessed due to the spring term disruption and the level of catch up intervention that has been needed particularly in Maths and English this year, but we feel it is important to give a benchmark of where we feel your child is at, using everything at our disposal.

There may be some subject areas where only an effort grade will be given if it is felt that an individual attainment grade would be too inaccurate to give.

I hope that makes sense, you understand the process and it helps you to understand your child's report.
