# WELCOME BACK

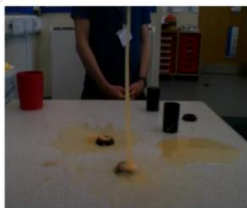
I hope that you have all had a restful Easter and are ready to head into the summer term. This week has been busy with children exploring their new theme ...

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## DFE REQUIREMENT FOR A SCHOOL DAY OF 32.5 HOURS

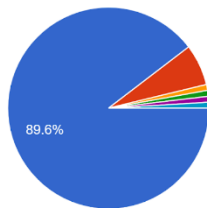
As previously communicated, the government has issued guidance requesting schools to deliver a set school week of at least 32.5 hours by September 2023.

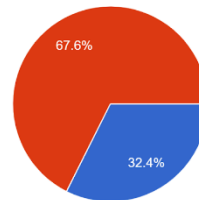

It was agreed with the Trust and the Local Governing Body that Lakeside would extend the school day by 5 minutes at the end of the day.

We currently operate a 10 minute arrival time which was in place from COVID with the doors opening at 8:45am. This is no longer a requirement and from September 2023 the doors will open at 8:40am with school starting at 8:45am. The register will be taken at 8:45am which will make us compliant with the 32.5hrs.
