



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BUG BUSTING WEEK — MONDAY 6TH NOVEMBER TO MONDAY 13TH NOVEMBER

As we shared in September we are having one week every half term which is called 'bug busting week'. Ordinarily it will be the first week of each half term. The approach has proved to be very effective in working towards the elimination of head lice from schools. We would therefore like to ask for your cooperation in introducing this regular event. We will occasionally also have one or two reports of head lice in school, so it is important to be vigilant. Also please tie up long hair as this helps prevent spreading them.

Bug Busting Week - What to do.

Please remember that we need every family to participate in order for our efforts to be effective.

Please proceed as follows:-

Starting from today, please check for head lice and eggs and wet-comb the hair of every member of your family at least once every three days for at least one full week.

Experts are divided as to whether wet-combing or chemical treatment is best but unless you find lice or eggs, it is better not to treat heads with chemical preparations.

If you are unfamiliar with head lice and would like more information or support about detection and treatment, please see Mrs Hayes-Smith or Miss Bamford.
