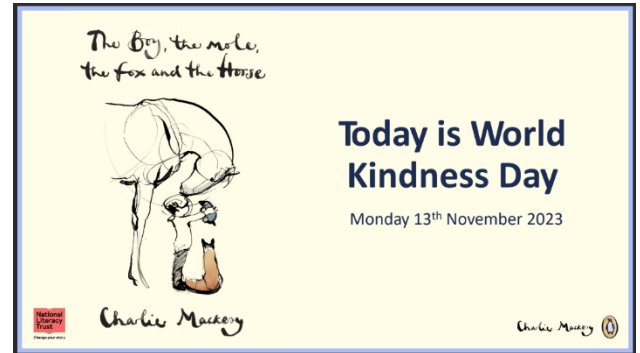




A MESSAGE FROM MRS HAYES-SMITH
